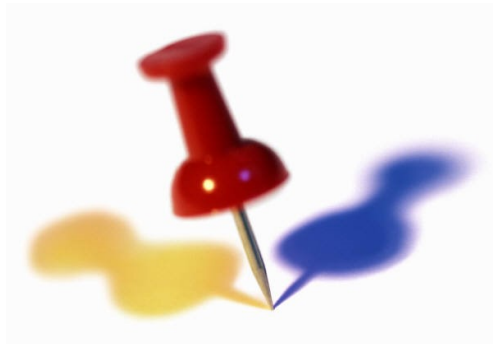

Find Your Pathway

The primary goal of Academy District 20's College Pathways is to provide opportunities for college-ready secondary students to **accelerate learning**. Students may earn college credit at a **significant cost and time savings** by taking courses on the post-secondary campus or by taking high school courses aligned with equivalent college courses. Students may also earn credit in robust, assessment-based national programs including Advanced Placement® (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB).

Academy 20 works with each student to tailor a meaningful plan for life after high school and also sets student dreams in motion with access to a full menu of post-secondary options.

Students may enroll in high school courses that are aligned with a local post-secondary institution and taught by approved Academy 20 teachers to earn dual college and high school credit.

- PPCC: \$10 per course
- UCCS–CU Succeed: \$75 per course
- UCCS–Project Lead the Way: \$102 per credit hour
- UC Denver: \$75 per course

Courses

College Instructor/Campus Pathways

Qualifying college-ready students may enroll in one of the programs listed below to earn dual college and high school credit. These courses are regular post-secondary courses taught by college or university instructors.

2018-19 Tuition

- ASCENT: \$75 application fee
- Career Start: \$75 application fee
- CE Academics: Varies (D20 pays the tuition at the prevailing on-campus community college per credit hour rate. Students pay the remaining balance, campus fees, and textbook costs)
- CU Succeed Platinum: \$75 per course plus cost of textbook
- Pre-Collegiate Development Program: \$75 per year plus summer meal cost
